HB 3474 Article 8 - Below is the excerpt-

Increase Jury Pay; may cause a calendar income of \$600.00, triggering the 1099 issuance.

Remind your Clerks, if they have not done so already that this must go through Commissioners Court. Commissioners Court can set a higher rate if they choose, although the State will only reimburse per the Statute.

Another item of note is the donation section; Items 1) and 2) are mandatory the others are by Commissioners Court approval.

ARTICLE 8. JURORS AND JURY SERVICE

SECTION 8.001. Section 61.001(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

- (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a person who reports for jury service in response to the process of a court is entitled to receive as reimbursement for travel and other expenses an amount:
- (1) not less than \$20 [\$6] for the first day or fraction of the first day the person is in attendance in court in response to the process and discharges the person's duty for that day; and
- (2) not less than \$58 [\$40] for each day or fraction of each day the person is in attendance in court in response to the process after the first day and discharges the person's duty for that day.

SECTION 8.002. Section 61.0015(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

- (a) The state shall reimburse a county:
- (1) \$14 a day for the reimbursement paid under Section 61.001(a)(1) to a person who reports for jury service in response to the process of a court for the first day or fraction of the first day in attendance in court in response to the process; and
- (2) \$52 [\$34] a day for the reimbursement paid under Section 61.001(a)(2) [61.001] to a person who reports for jury service in response to the process of a court for each day or fraction of each day after the first day in attendance in court in response to the process.

SECTION 8.003. Sections 61.003(a) and (b), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) Each [After jury service is concluded, each] person who reports [reported] for jury service shall be [personally] provided the opportunity, either through a written form or electronically, to direct [a form letter that when signed by the person directs] the county treasurer or a designated county employee to donate all, [or] a specific amount designated by the person, or the entire amount divided among the funds, programs, and county entities listed in this subsection of the person's daily reimbursement under this chapter to:

Mission Statement

"Dedication and cooperation with the community to promote fair and impartial investigations and prosecutions of felony criminal acts and provide compassionate and quality teamwork for supporting and empowering victims/survivors."

Primary objectives of the SART Team ("Team") as required by Local Government Code Chapter 351:

INTRODUCTION

- 1. To improve services to victims of adult sexual assault in the 100th Judicial District;
- 2. To ensure accurate evidence collection and testing to promote the apprehension and prosecution of perpetrators. It is hoped that, with this mission statement in mind and established protocols, the Team will be better able to accomplish its objectives and, ultimately, provide optimal care for the victim of sexual assault.

TEAM MEMBERS

As Required by Local Government Code Chapter 351.252 to 351.255 and 351.258

- 1. SART Team shall be comprised of the following:
 - a) Prosecutor;
 - b) Designee of each Police Department and Sheriff's Office;
 - c) Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner;
 - d) Behavioral Health Services Provider;
 - e) Designee of a program that provides services for the District;
 - f) Other persons the team considers necessary for the operation of the team
- 2. Team members must be presented and approved by the Commissioner's Court of each county;

- 3. A Team member must attend the quarterly meetings held as required to participate in Team functions. Meeting will be the first Tuesday of the months of March, June, September and December of each year;
- 4. If a Team member is unable to participate in a Team meeting, the member or entity the member is representing may designate another individual to represent the member or entity at the meeting. Each member or a designee of that member must participate in all team meeting;
- 5. Team members must maintain strict compliance regarding confidentiality of information;
- 6. If any Team member is found to not be in compliance, the Team member may be removed by majority vote and the Team will make a recommendation for replacement for Commissioner's Court approval.

SART MODEL

As Required by Local Government Code Chapter 351.256

- 1. Streamlined communications between law enforcement, health care and prosecutors. Interagency information sharing, in accordance with State and federal law, to ensure the timely exchange of relevant information and enhance the response to survivors;
- 2. Team shall assess community trends, including drug-facilitated sexual assault, the incidents of predatory date rape and sex trafficking;
- 3. Team shall hold a biennial evaluation through sexual assault case reviews of the effectiveness of individual agency and interagency protocols and systems;
- 4. Team Members shall complete at least four hours of annual cross-agency training on the dynamics of sexual assault:
- 5. Ensure the availability of and access to medical care when the care is clinically indicated;
- 6. Waiting room separate, and at a distance from the interview room;
- 7. SART Team may only review a sexual assault case of an adult survivor with the signed, written consent of the survivor. The consent must specify: the information or records covered by the release; the reason or purpose for the release; and the person or agency to which the information is to be released;
- 8. A trained advocate to be friend, provide support, provide initial crisis intervention and attend Sexual Assault Exam. (CCP Art. 56.045,f.);
- 9. Law Enforcements timely submission of forensic evidence to laboratory;
- 10. Referral and information on the availability of and access to mental and behavioral health services;
- 11. Ensure the victim is notified in a timely manner regarding the status of any criminal case and/or court proceeding;
- 12. Sexual Assault Forensic Examinations shall be conducted at Northwest Texas

Healthcare with the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner's under the direction of Director, Becky O'Neal.

PROCEDURES TO BE USED IN INVESTIGATING AND PROSECUTING SEXUAL ASSAULT CASES

- 1. Law Enforcement is notified of a sexual assault;
- 2. Crisis Center is notified of the sexual assault;
- 3. Law Enforcement determines a sexual assault has occurred;
- 4. District Attorney is contacted and approval is required for an exam;
- 5. SANE is notified and begins forensic examination process;
- 6. Crisis Advocate provides crisis intervention, support and referrals;
- 7. Disposition of evidence:
- 8. Depending on case facts, case may be referred to District Attorney's Office;
- 9. Judicial Proceedings
