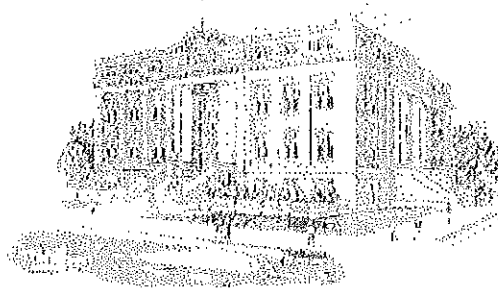

- A.** Fire Chief Terry Altman asked for the County's help with the purchase of tires for the Grass Rigs that are used mainly to fight fires in the rural parts of the county. The tires are \$475 a piece from Bowie Racko Parts. The Memphis Fire Dept. would like for the County to purchase 10 tires. Nick Narvaez will contact the tire shop and see if the county may purchase 14 tires at \$450 each.

Motion by Commissioner Lindsey and seconded by Commissioner Proffitt and It is the Order of the Court to purchase 14 tires @ \$450 each out of Contingency Funds and Nick Narvaez was asked to contact Turkey Fire Dept. and see if they needed tires also. It needed the tires would be split between Memphis and Turkey Volunteer Fire Departments.

- B.** Update on the Restoration of the Courthouse.

Lee Evans, Premier Commercial Group Project Manager, reported that Premier will go back to January 2026 and pay the expenses on the storage building and Arthur Weinman, Architect, expenses also. Son and Skye Electric is back working and will be hiring extra help.

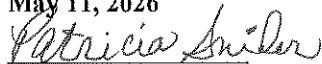

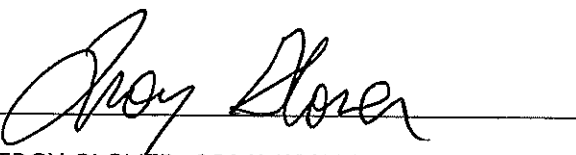
